## A walk through Glebe's past, present and future



In October 2022 Tranby Aboriginal Co-operative Ltd. with support from our local Elders and community has led the first Glebe Stories Festival, a celebration of community connection, story-sharing and places of past, present and future.

For thousands of years, Gadigal land has been cared for and made strong through stories and culture. In the spirit of story-sharing, we have collaborated with local legends from around Glebe to bring you the true stories and memories of this incredible community. Walk through the streets of Glebe, while scanning the QR code in the identified locations (see on the next page) to listen to our Elders and community members about places of significance in Glebe.

On this self-guided tour, you will visit Tranby Aboriginal Co-operative, BLACKBOOKS, Glebe Point Road, the old site of NAISDA, Galluzo's Fruit Market, The Glebe War Memorial, Scar Tree Ministries, the original site of Elsie's Refuge and Glebe Primary School.

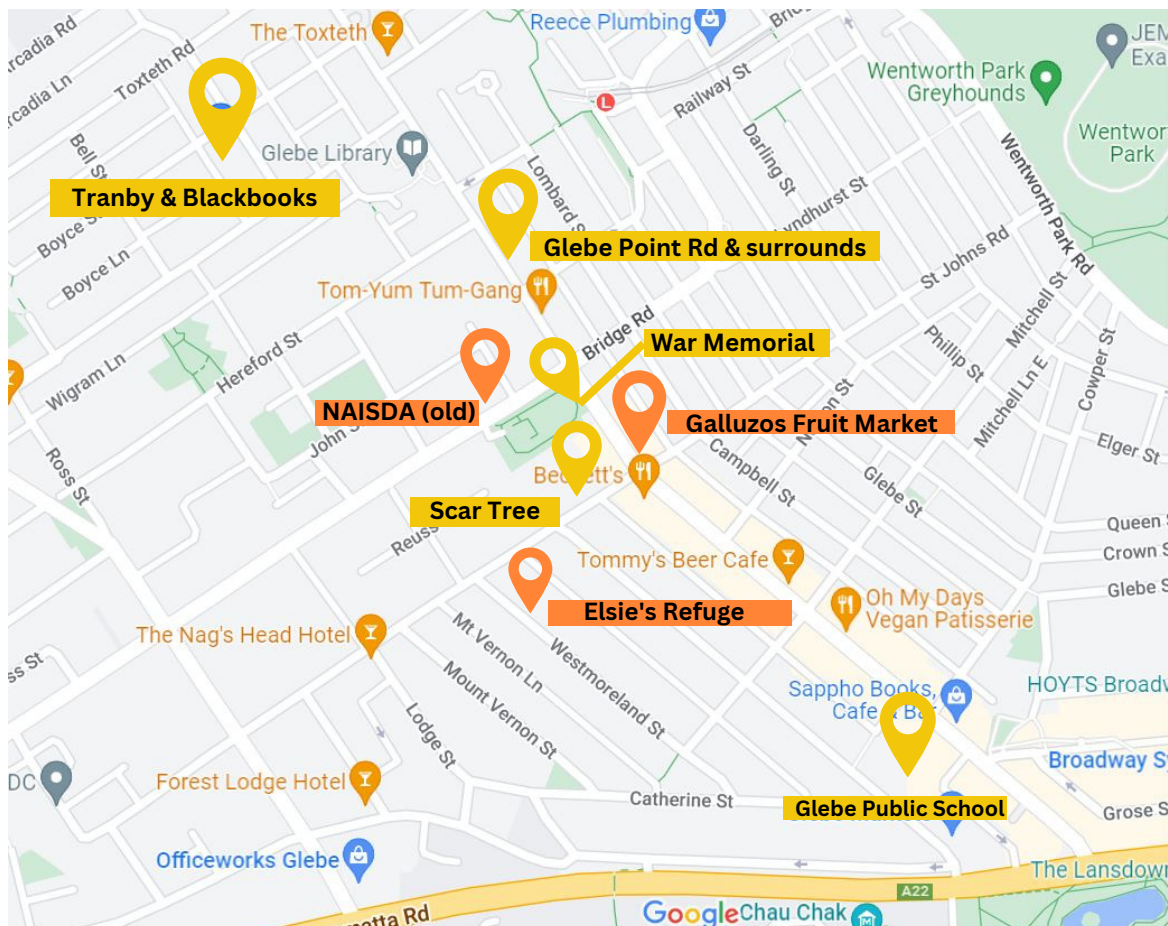


# Self-Guided Walking Tour Steps

Please follow these simple steps for a memorable self-guided tour through the eyes, stories and memories of Elders and long-time community members of our Glebe.

1. **Look at the map below and orientate yourself on it.** Find the location you are closest too and walk to that location. (We recommend you start at Tranby on 13 Mansfield St or Glebe Public School)
2. **Once at your starting location look for the laminated QR Code.** HINT you'll see the Glebe Stories Festival logo of the Gadigal fisherwomen.
3. **Scan the QR code** to find the location's story on Spotify. Put on your earphones to listen and open your ears, hearts and eyes!
4. Once completed, walk to the next location and **follow steps 2 and 3**
